A Unique Opportunity

Peter's message to "be subject" rolls out of the ream of politics and into the realm of jobs. Many moderns have balked at what seems to be Peter's complacency concerning workplace injustices. Elsewhere, Paul tells slaves to obey their masters (Eph. 6:5) as if condoning slavery. "Why this tolerance? Didn't Christ teach that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights? Aren't we supposed to picket and protest, demanding our rights and the rights of our neighbor?" These are great questions that cannot be adequately answered here in a short article. But, I wonder if our immediate impulse to demand our rights comes more from Jefferson than it does from Jesus.

Here's what Peter says to those "elect exiles" after admonishing them to be subject to even one as suspect as the Roman Emperor:

"Servants, be subject to your masters with all respect,

not only to the good and gentle but also to the unjust. For this is a gracious thing, when, mindful of God, one endures sorrows while suffering unjustly."

1 Peter 3:18-19

Most of us work in environments that are a little more employee-friendly than the environment Peter's audience knows. Not many of us refer to ourselves as "servants" or "slaves" nor to our bosses as "masters." Nonetheless, most of us work within some hierarchy of employment, having someone above us, someone telling us what to do, someone watching us, and someone to whom we're accountable.

And here's the sad truth: not many of us work for gentle, kind, and caring people. Sometimes bosses are not the most mature or admirable people. Bosses might be lazy, demanding, dishonest, crass, or greedy, all the while making a lot more money than those under them who oftentimes work harder than they do. Many of our work environments and situations are simply unjust, as they were in Peter's day.

Peter looks onto the world of unjust jobs and sees a unique opportunity. His initial impulse is not to picket and protest, nor is it to quit (though, there are times those actions are appropriate), but instead he tells these mistreated servants to "endure sorrow," as if to say, "As a Christian, you have a more important job than your job to do." As Christians, wherever we work, our primary job is to work in such a way that follows the example of Christ and points those around us to the Gospel.
